St. Louis Hospital Leads in 2006 Donations

As one of the busiest hospitals in the Shrine system, and with a cadre of world-renowned physicians, we've become accustomed to being one of the leading institutions among the 22 Shriners Hospitals. This week, we received additional confirmation of our leadership.

According to a report compiled by the corporate development department, Shriners Hospital - St. Louis leads all hospital in the amount of donations received during 2006. In fact, we are the only hospital in the system whose donations, or income (\$25 million) totaled more than our budget, or expenditures (\$22 million).

Only three hospitals exceeded the \$20 million mark - St. Louis, Cincinnati, and Northern California. Here are the top 10:
